California

California Department of Justice

The California Department of Justice is organized into ten divisions. The Division of Civil Law prosecutes and defends civil actions. The Division of Public Rights serves the people by safeguarding the state's environmental and natural resources, protecting state lands, maintaining competitive business markets, preventing fraudulent business practices, protecting consumers, preserving charitable assets, and protecting civil rights. The Division of Criminal Law represents the people of California in criminal cases. The Division of Law Enforcement maintains several crime suppression programs and provides a wide range of support to other state and local law enforcement agencies through forensic sciences, narcotics investigation, intelligence, and training. The Division of Gambling Control regulates legal gambling activities to ensure that gambling is conducted honestly, competitively, and free from criminal and corruptive elements. The California Justice Information Services Division facilitates the exchange of criminal justice intelligence among law enforcement agencies, using improving technologies to help protect the public. The Division of Legal Support and Technology delivers expert administrative technology and support services within the Department and to client agencies. The Division of Firearms is responsible for identifying individuals who are ineligible to acquire or possess firearms and other dangerous weapons. The Executive Division provides the support network for the attorney general and includes those functions not directly related to the office's litigation or law enforcement responsibilities. Finally, the Administrative Division supports the day-to-day operations of the California Department of Justice and its personnel.

The Homeland Security division was set up to collect information about homeland security threats, train personnel responsible for the management of crisis situations, and develop and evaluate an effective first-response team.

The Forensics Division offers services such as clandestine labs/crime scenes, firearms, DNA, toxicology, and fingerprints. The Investigations Division specializes in crime scene investigation, drug enforcement, polygraph services, police integrity investigations, executive protection, and violent crimes. The law enforcement programs at Idaho State Police provide services such as alcoholic beverages enforcement, domestic and foreign terrorism (and any associated criminal activities), and security services for public officials and government buildings, and investigate areas such as white collar crime, major drug traffickers/financiers, and computer crimes. The Communication Center screens and prioritizes calls for assistance and service, dispatches patrol and other emergency units, ensures patrol officer safety, and coordinates a situation through to its conclusion.
